Transgender Glossary

Transgender

Umbrella term used to refer to individuals who cross or transcend culturally defined categories of gender. Includes transsexuals, transvestites, crossdressers, transgenderists, bigender persons, drag queens and kings, and female and male impersonators.

Transsexual

Person who desires or has undergone hormone therapy and/or sex reassignment surgery to resolve an extreme conflict between gender identity (basic conviction of being a man, woman, or other gender) and sex assigned at birth (male or female anatomy).

Crossdresser (transvestite)

Person who desires to wear clothing associated with another sex, for varied reasons.

Transgenderist

Person who lives in the gender role associated with another sex without desiring sex reassignment surgery.

Bigender person

Person who identifies as both man and woman.

Drag queen/king

Usually a gay man or lesbian woman who "does drag" and dresses up in, respectively, women's and men's clothes.

Female/male impersonator

A male who impersonates a woman or a female who impersonates a man, usually for entertainment or performance.
